**RESIDENTS OF THIS FACILITY MAY RETURN FOR CLEANUP ONLY.**

**PLEASE READ THESE IMPORTANT WARNINGS FOR YOUR HEALTH AND SAFETY.**

1. **The Order of Closure may be reinstated** at any time without warning if weather conditions change.
2. **The Order of Safe Debris Disposal is still in effect** and must be followed by residents and contractors.
3. Although the Order of Closure is currently lifted, **it is not safe to reside or camp in this area, even if your residence is undamaged**. Please remain in the area only for the minimum amount of time necessary to arrange safe cleanup or retrieve personal property. **Only residents, management and visitors directly involved in cleanup should be present. Pets and animals should avoid the area.**
4. **It is highly likely that asbestos, toxic heavy metals and other toxic compounds are present in the ash** in this area. The Order of Closure was lifted because of improved weather conditions, but you may still inadvertently inhale or consume toxic compounds by handling or disturbing the ash without proper protection. **Do not handle ash or items that have been in the ash with your bare hands.**
5. **Children, the elderly, pregnant women or any individual with heart or lung disease should avoid the area and not have any contact with ash nor be involved in any cleanup or search.** These high-risk individuals should not be present in this area unless absolutely necessary.
6. If you must handle or search the ashes, **wear a properly fitted N-95 mask** (available from any hardware store), **gloves, long sleeves, long pants and goggles**. **Wash all ash off skin promptly. Do not use vacuums or blowers. Minimize use of shovels and rakes. Change clothes and shoes and remove gloves before leaving this area to avoid tracking ash into your vehicle or other nearby areas. Do not handle ash or items that have been in the ash with your bare hands.** Wash any personal property thoroughly.
7. Property owners must register and obtain permission from the Riverside County Department of Waste Resources before disposing of debris or ash. **Do not dispose of debris or ash in the regular trash.**
8. Although you **may take your personal property with you, do not remove debris or ash from this area** unless authorized by the Riverside County Department of Environmental Health, the Riverside County Department of Waste Resources, the California Department of Toxic Substances Control or the United States Environmental Protection Agency in accordance with the Order of Safe Debris Disposal.
